POLICE REPORT:

- Chief Fitzgerald reported that the Police Department has been talking and educating a
 lot of youngsters and parents on the new e-bike and scooter laws. They have had mostly
 positive interactions to this point. Sadly, Chief has not made an education video yet.
- The department now has the new Interceptor and both used Interceptors that were purchased. We are still awaiting delivery of the F-150. Federal Signal is waiting for two plexiglass partitions for the prisoner compartment to come in, and it will be completed and ready for delivery. M161, which is the older Interceptor, was newly lettered. Our fleet now matches, with exception of the remaining Tahoe.
- Chief Fitzgerald stated they are working on the administrative towing ordinance and will have some version for the board's approval by the first of the year.
- Administrator Agee and Chief Fitzgerald have also been working on putting all of our
 ordinances in an Excel format. This is being done for the purpose of the new Digi-ticket
 format and for CIRDC's new system. Unfortunately, the person who previously set up
 Digi-ticket used very old ordinances. This has been a time-consuming and tedious task.
 They are also pushing to have this completed by the first of the year. Once that is
 completed, they will be able to design a proper ordinance citation; currently, we must
 handwrite and cross out a lot.

ATTORNEY REPORT:

- The foreclosure date for 418 S Wood is November 12th.
- Attorney Wise stated she is also working on another real estate matter for us and she
 has an email to forward to the Mayor and City Administrator.

ENGINEER REPORT:

• The contract is written out for the Wood Street project but we are requesting IDOT to expand to the Main Street project as well.

ADMINISTRATOR/ZONING REPORT:

- Our electricity and natural gas contracts with Direct Energy is ending on October 30th.
- Direct Energy electric service (excludes delivery): \$0.11605 per kWh for a 12-month contract, \$0.11923 per kWh for a 24-month contract, \$0.12096 for a 36-month contract and \$0.12294 per kWh for a 48-month contract.
- Direct Energy gas service (excludes delivery): We were unable to secure current pricing for natural gas due to our original contract being processed through a broker (ABM).
- Ameren electric service (excludes delivery): \$0.094 per kWh.
- Ameren gas service (excludes delivery): November rate \$4.60 per MMBTU.
- It appears Ameren is less expensive than continuing with Direct Energy/NRG at this time. It would be recommended to notify Direct Energy/NRG our intent to return to Ameren for supply upon the expiration of our contract and then explore other potential contracts moving forward.
- IDOT GRANT: We have been awarded a \$275,000.00 grant from IDOT to cover the cost
 of preliminary engineering for updates to Wood Street. Proposed updates include
 replacing sidewalks, ADA complaint approaches, reconfiguring traffic lanes and adding
 bike lanes. We have subsequently petitioned IDOT to expand this grant to include
 preliminary engineering for Main Street upgrades from Wood Street to Oak Street.
- We have received an offer of \$2,500.00 for the 2017 Chevrolet Tahoe VIN 1GNSKDEC3GR252948.
- North ballfield: We are having improvements made to level out the infield/outfield ridge, correct base alignments and improve drainage.
- Chris Doak will donate his labor for the ridge removal and dirt if necessary, and the City will cover with seed and fertilizer.
- There is a batting cage safety concern. Balls are occasionally hitting the poles and rebounding. The solution is to flip the cage inward or explore new cages.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT:

- The new filter media has been working well.
- Hydrant flushing should be completed by the end of the week.
- There are a couple of fire hydrants that are having a few issues opening.
- One of the well's casing is in need of repair.
- Leaf pickup will begin shortly.
